



Q5 What is your sexual orientation?







Q10 What is your total gross family/household income (before taxes)?





Q12 How many years have you been associated with our congregation?



Q13 How many years have you been associated with Unitarian Universalism?



Q14 How important is your affiliation with this congregation to your identity as an individual?



Q15 How important is your affiliation with UUism in general to your identity as an individual?





Q21 Did you serve on a committee or council in the last year?





Q24 Thinking of a time when you have been in need of comfort or support, to what extent did the congregation reach out and offer comfort or support to you?



Q25 To what extent is your affiliation with this congregation a source of strength or comfort to you?


